	Petra Breakstone (K)	Sand to Sea – crescent shawl inspired by sweet summer days and an outing to the ocean with a bit of lace	320 yards worsted (Yarnz2Go Fringed Cotton Tape) (4 different colors shown in sample)
November	Jenn Rinella (K)	Agnate – a reversible cable cowl, Agnate means related through males	3 skeins of bulky/chunky (Blue Sky Alpaca Bulky, Misti Alpaca Chunky) OR 2 skeins worsted (Lazy Catt Terrestrial, Theodora’s Pearls Acacius)
	Jenn Rinella (C)	Agnate – mirrored cables in honor of how we may look similar to our siblings	2 skeins worsted (Dream in Color Classy)
December	Tim Stephens (K)	Men’s necktie – 100% reversible, good TV knit, child or adult size available	1 skein fingering (Round Table, Safronie, Lazy Cat Yarn) (solid, semi-solid, handdyed)
